County Recorder's Office Update

Alameda County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public (including recording services); a locked drop box will be available outside for documents to be recorded; it appears that documents will only be picked up once a day in the morning and the recorder's office will do its best to process recordings same day. No same day corrections for rejected orders; recording confirmations are very delayed and not guaranteeing same-day turnaround time.

Alpine County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents but expect 1-3 day delays for confirmation.

Amador County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents.

Butte County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Calaveras County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents; only accepting drop off once a day by 11:00am.

Colusa County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents.

Contra Costa County– closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Advised to expect delays in eRecording turnaround times.

Del Norte County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents but expect 1-3 day delays for recording confirmation.

El Dorado County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Fresno County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Glenn County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents.

Humboldt County - one of the CA counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents.

Imperial County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record - staying open for now; however, the recorder's office will only accept documents for recording once in the morning until 10:30am

Inyo County – one of the CA counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public; processing mailed documents but expect 1-3 day delay for recording confirmations.

Kern County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Kings County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – staying open with limited hours from 10:00am to 1:00pm during when it will accept recordings to be processed the next business day; also processing mailed documents.

Lake County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed to the public and is only accepted documents through drop off on Mondays and Thursday; expect a 3-4 day delay on recording confirmations.

Lassen County – one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed; there is no information regarding how recordings are being processed.

Los Angeles County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Advised to expect delays in eRecording turnaround times.

Madera County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Marin County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents; only drop off once per day in the morning for paper documents.

Mariposa County – one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office is closed; processing mailed documents; expect a 1-3 day delay in recording confirmations.

Mendocino County - one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – the recorder's office has limited hours and services.

Merced County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings.

Modoc County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents; expect a 1-3 day delay in recording confirmations.

Mono County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents; expect a 1-3 day delay in recording confirmations.

Monterey County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Napa County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Nevada County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Orange County – closed to the public until further notice - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Advised to expect delays in eRecording turnaround times.

Placer County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

RECORDER OFFICE INFORMATION

Plumas County – one of the CA Counties that does not e-record – is now closed. Recordings may be left in an available dropbox that is located outside the interior recorder's door; then a call is made to have the recorder retrieve the documents. The county recorder will then fax the recording confirmation. Expect 1-3 day delays in recording confirmations.

Riverside County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Sacramento County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

San Benito County – one of the CA Counties that does not e-record; closed to the general public; permitting recording services to drop off documents once per day for paper recordings; working reduced hours 8:00am through 1:00pm.

San Bernardino County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Advised to expect delays in eRecording turnaround times.

San Diego County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

San Francisco County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. eRecordings hours will be expanded until 4:00pm.

San Joaquin County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents; expect a 1-3 day delay in recording confirmations.

San Luis Obispo County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents; also added a drop box at 1055 Monterey Street.

San Mateo County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Santa Barbara County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Advised to expect delays in eRecording turnaround times. Still trying to work out how paper recordings are being processed or how rejected documents will be handled.

Santa Clara County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Advised to expect delays in eRecording turnaround times.

Santa Cruz County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Shasta County – closed to the public – processing eRecordings and mailed documents.

Sierra County – one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – processing mailed documents only. Not accepting overnight shipments; check with your recording service.

Siskiyou County – one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – processing mailed documents only.

Solano County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents; expect delays in recording confirmations.

Sonoma County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents; drop box available; expect delays in recording confirmations.

Stanislaus County - one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – closed to the general public; one morning drop off time and no special recordings.

Sutter County - one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – closed to the general public; one drop off permitted for recording services.

Tehama County - closed to the public – processing eRecordings. For mailed documents, county is not accepting documents from overnight couriers; please check you're your recording service as many are suspending mailed recordings in this county. For mailed documents, county is accepting documents from FedEx deliveries.

Trinity County - one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – temporarily ceasing to record paper documents and not accepting documents from overnight couriers; please check you're your recording service as many are suspending recordings in this county.

Tulare County – closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Note: due to staff limitations, recordings may not be processed same day if not sent in until close to cut off time.

Tuolumne County - one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – closed to the public; recording services are permitted to record once per day.

Ventura County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents. Effective Wednesday, March 26, 2020 and until further notice, the eRecording submission que will close at 12:00pm.

Yolo County - one of the CA Counties that do not e-record – closed to the public; recording services are permitted to record once in the morning and once in the afternoon. Cutoff time for recording releases is 9:00am.

Yuba County - closed to the public - processing eRecordings and mailed documents; recording services are permitted to record once per day.

****NOTE:** in addition to the above limitations, a number of counties have changed the "cut-off" time for recording package submissions and many of the small county recorder's offices have reduced the hours of operations and advised of 1-3 day recording confirmation delays.**
